

Safe Operating Procedures

W35 Dish Machine Detergent, **W45** Rinse Additive

Suitable for use in kitchens and food preparation areas.

Task

Dishwashing - Automatic Machine

Chemical

W35 Dish Machine Detergent, W45 Rinse Additive

Procedure

1. For the first use of the day, ensure drain plug is firmly in place.
2. Switch unit on "FILL" cycle and wait until unit is full.
3. Make sure all sink detergent & food scraps are well rinsed before placing in machine
4. Turn heater on and allow unit to heat water to wash temperature.
5. Run the machine (either with tray of dirty dishes or without) and ensure that detergent and rinse aid feeds are functioning.
6. After a few cycles, check that the water temperatures are as follows:
 - a. Wash cycle: between 62°C to 65°C
 - b. Rinse cycle: 82°C to 85°C
7. At the end of each day, turn machine "OFF" and remove drain plug to empty dirty water. Depending on the use of machine, it will vary as to how often you will need to change the wash water.



⚠ Precautions

- Dishwasher should be descaled approximately every 6 weeks.
- Keep door closed during wash and rinse cycles. Never use a foaming detergent in the machine.
- If the unit is not functioning correctly, contact your service technician.
- Wear chemical goggles.
- Maintain adequate ventilation when using.
- Use rubber elbow length gloves and apron.
- Always read SDS & labels before using chemical product.

☠ Hazards

- Rinse water is very hot (82-85°C).
- Will cause severe burns to the mouth, throat and stomach with effects including mucous build-up, irritation to the tongue and lips and pains in the stomach, which may lead to nausea, vomiting and diarrhea.
- Will cause severe burns to the eyes with effects including: tearing, pain, corneal opacity and blurred vision. Risk of serious damage to eyes.
- Will cause severe burns to the skin, with effects including; redness, itching and drying/defatting.
- Mists from the product Will cause irritation to the nose, throat and respiratory system with effects including; coughing, discomfort, breathing difficulty and shortness of breath.
- Prolonged or repeated skin contact may lead to dermatitis.
- Prolonged eye contact may cause permanent eye damage.
